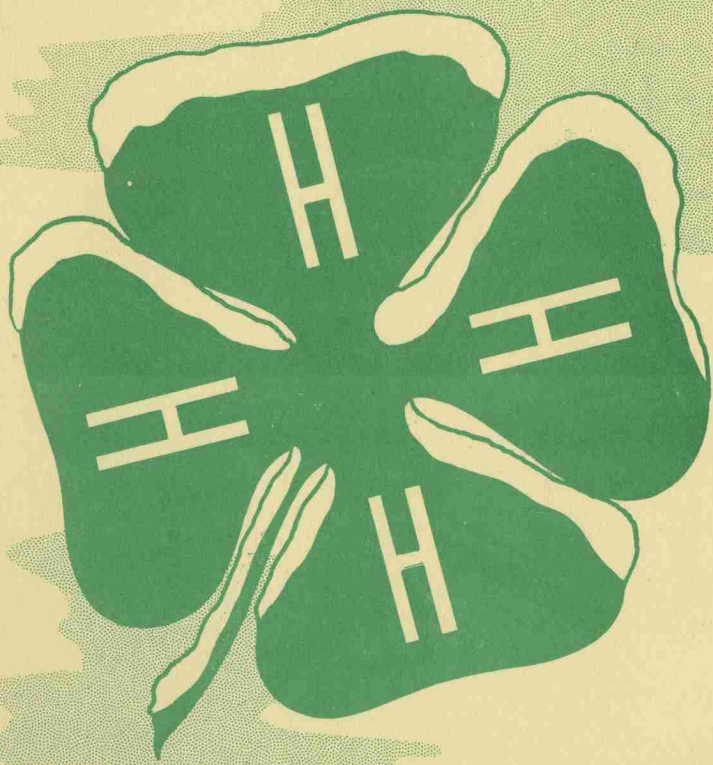


# 4-Hward

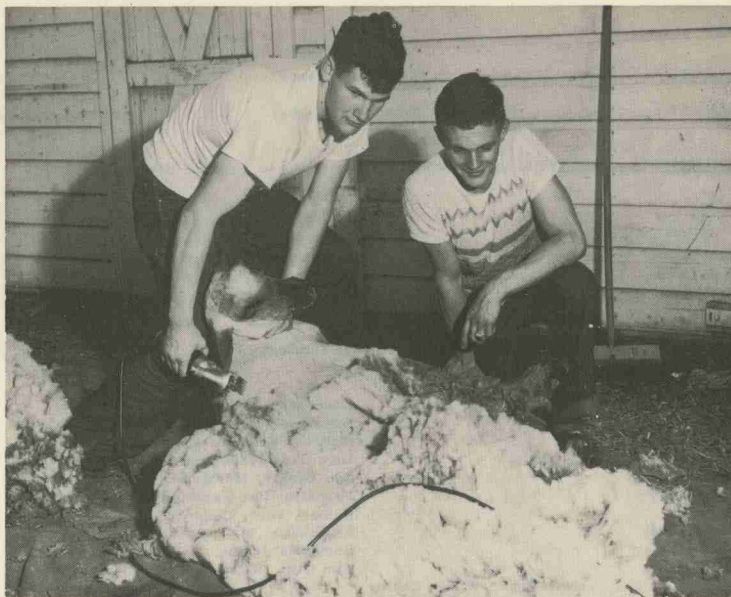
