

Introduction to Project

Ladies and Gents, it's good to know you are interested in one of the 4-H Home Improvement projects in "Wake Up!! Furnish an Area." You have your choice of improving either your dressing, your sleeping, your study, or your storage area. Or you may choose several of these in one year.

In the 4-H Home Improvement Project you will have the opportunity to acquire a knowledge of the principles and materials involved in making homes more attractive, convenient, and livable. You will have an opportunity to develop skills and appreciation for your room.

If you share your room, perhaps your roommate will have ideas, too. Parents and 4-H Home Improvement Leaders and your Agricultural Extension Agents stand by to help you and wish you the best.

In this manual and record book, space is given for your records and project requirement account. You are encouraged to give talks, demonstrations, and help conduct tours, as these do contribute to your personal development and accomplishment.

Keeping Records

The 4-H record is a measuring stick; its facts and figures keep the Club member, parents and leaders informed of progress. Upon completion, submit the completed record and story to the Community 4-H Home Improvement Leader on the date requested. A record of work done should be kept accurately and neatly according to instructions.

Awards

Awards are offered to encourage greater effort by Club members. In every project certificates are awarded to the individual for the completion of a project and to county, district, and state winners on the basis of the best project summary record.

Project Completion Requirements

In this project "Wake Up!! Furnish an Area," you and the Home Improvement members will make, select, renovate, and arrange furnishings that will help you make the best use of each area of your rooms.

There are four main areas in your bedroom. If you entertain your classmates and friends there, you could plan for five areas. For

everyday living, however, we will consider areas for studying, dressing, sleeping, and storage.

You will notice that there are "seven" big sections to complete for one project. In the first section which is I., you have a choice of the areas which are listed as:

A. Study Area, B. Sleeping Area, C. Dressing Area, and D. Storage Area. Within each of these, too, you have a choice.

Read your requirements carefully. With family members and 4-H Home Improvement leaders' help, select the area or areas you are most interested in. Ask for the leaflets that will help give you ideas for your area or areas. These leaflets will be of help in making plans for your project.


- I. Bedroom (Select one area for your project.)
 - A. The Study Area

You will want to:

- 1. Plan a study area and make a scale drawing of it.
- Arrange furniture and accessories you now own, according to the plan.
- 3. List articles and furniture needed.
- Plan things you want to make or select, such as pin-up board, book ends, lamp, book shelves, wastebasket, blotter ends, etc.
- Plan things you want to renovate or remodel (chair, table, picture frames, bookcases).
- 6. Select and complete 3 jobs listed below:
 - Renovate or remodel a chair table, picture frames, bookcases.
 - b. Refinish furniture in area, or paint to carry out the color scheme.
 - c. Select or make three of the following items: pin-up board, drawer dividers, wastebasket, book ends, blotter holders, pictures for study


area, or a good reading lamp.

d. Provide storage space for books, stationery, hobbies, etc.



You will want to:

- Take a picture or make a sketch of the sleeping area before and after improvement.
- List needed improvements in sleeping area in order in which they are to be made.
- 3. Make plans.
- 4. Arrange furniture according to plan.
- 5. Select and complete 3 jobs listed below:
 - a. Make, remodel, or refinish a bedstead or bedside table.
 - Buy or make a rug, a mattress pad for the bed, or a bedspread.
 - c. Learn to make a bed correctly (if not already known).
 - d. Select and place accessories--pictures, lamps, bed pillows, etc.
 - e. If necessary, lengthen sheets to measure 108 inches.
 - Buy mattress, springs, sheets, or blankets, if needed.



You will want to:

 Take picture or make a sketch drawn to scale of your dressing area.




- Plan improvements needed and list in the order planned to make them.
- 3. Select and complete 3 jobs listed below:
 - a. Plan and make a dressing unit.
 - 1) Dresser or dressing table.
 - a) An old piece of furniture.
 - b) Boxes (with skirt).
 - c) Area made as a built-in.
 - Dresser seat: Select, remodel, or refinish a chair or bench.
 - Buy or make lamps, wastebasket, pictures and other accessories.
 - c. Plan and make a division in drawer space.
 - d. Plan and make storage needed for area.

D. The Storage Area

You will want to:


- Draw to scale the storage space before and after improvements are made.
- 2. Make plans for storage.
- Build in shelves, rods, shoe racks and hooks.



- Make or select shoe racks, shoe bags, laundry bags, hat boxes, dress covers.
- b. Paint inside closet.
- c. Use door space as well as space inside closet.



- Provide drawer space in addition to your closet.
- e. If there is no closet in your room, plan and build one.
- f. Refinish closet floor or cover it.
- II Learn more about selecting quality fabric.





- III. Learn more about choosing and combining color, texture, and pattern for furnishings.
- IV. Keep room neat, clean, and in order for at least one month.
- V. Give an illustrated talk, demonstration, or a special report.
- VI. Keep a record of work done.
- VII. Write a story.

Before You Begin

In preparing for the 4-H Home Improvement project in any of the four areas of a bedroom, consideration should be given to the total effect desired when the whole room is finished.

The background, which consists of walls, coverings, color, floor and window treatment, must be a part of your planning.

The way you use color and the way you arrange your room help determine how happy you will really be with your accomplishments.

Although you are planning only a small area of your room as a project, you will want to study color and room arrangement. What you learn here this year will help you in other room improvement projects.

Color is one of the first things your 4-H Home Improvement leader will discuss. There is a pamphlet called "Color and Design" which you will use in your study and discussions.

A soft, blending color in your room is not as tiring as a sharp, dramatic contrast.

Choose your color scheme by:

- 1. Starting with a pattern you like.
 - a. In a floor covering.
 - b. In a fabric.
 - c. In a wallpaper.
 - d. In a picture.
- 2. Or starting with a favorite color.
- 3. Or starting with what you have.

Room arrangement is important, too. In arranging your bedroom, get furniture and furnishings that go together. This will make up the unit you wish to improve. Make a scale drawing of before you start and one afterwards. Ask your leader for furniture cut-outs as you study your leaflet "Arrangement of My Bedroom."

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


"AFTER" FLOOR PLAN


