PERSONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE AVAILABLE

Personal Liability coverage is available for 4-H Agents through the Chapel Hill Insurance Agency. This coverage is protection against legal liability for bodily injury and property damage, including defense expense arising out of employment duties. An extension of coverage is provided to protect against personal injury which consists of:

- A. False arrest, detention or imprisonment or malicious prosecution.
- B. Libel, slander, defamation or violation of the Right to Privacy.
- C. Wrongful entry or eviction or other invasion of Right to Private Occupancy.

Limits

Bodily Injury: \$500,000 each person

\$500,000 each occurrence

Personal Injury: \$500,000 each person

\$500,000 each occurrence

Property Damage: \$50,000 each occurrence

A yearly premium of \$5.25 is payable at any time during the year. The coverage, however, is from September 1, 1986 to August 31, 1987. Because of the small premium involved, no reduction in premium can be granted if you enroll later in the year.
