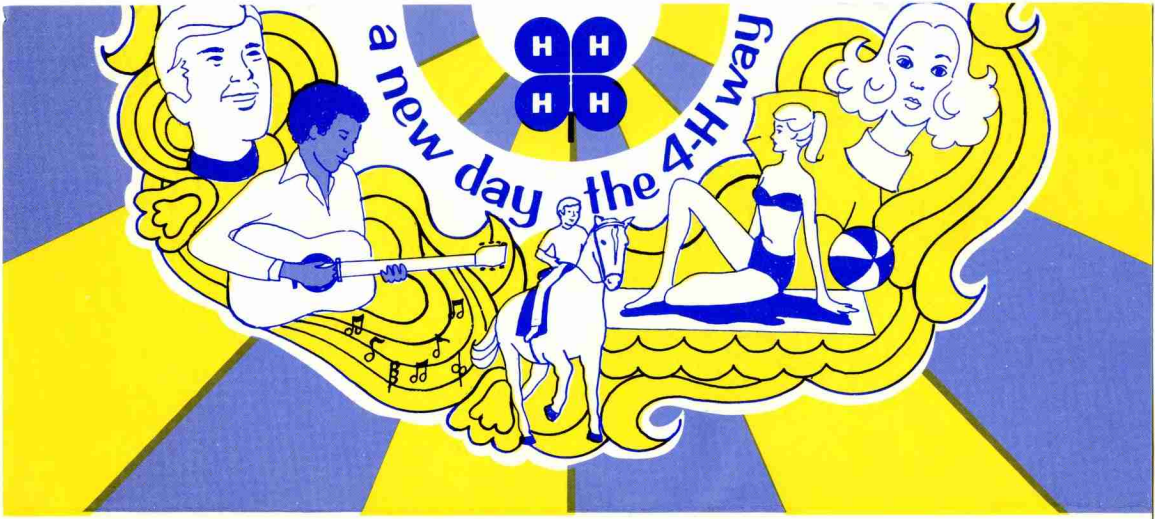

4-H is being with people you like and learning about plants, animals, foods, managing your money, making clothes and lots of other things boys and girls hear about.

In 4-H you go to camp, take tours and go on hikes. You cook out and go on field trips. You can earn money. And you can learn to make things you and your family can use. You can do things for your community and your town.

Boys and girls take part in 4-H in several ways. They might be members of a special interest group or a project group to learn more about a particular subject. Some are members of a community club which meets in the homes of members or in a community building after school hours or at night. Still

others participate in 4-H through television study series or on an individual basis as a member at large. Even though a 4-H group may be organized in much the same way, no two groups are exactly alike. Each group is made up of individuals who have different interests and needs. The groups can be boys or girls—or both boys and girls.

4-H groups have leaders. Your leader might be an older boy or girl, your best friend's mother, one of the men in your community or your dad. Your leader will get help in the form of literature and training from the County Extension Office.

Any boy or girl 9 to 19 years old may be in 4-H. If you are interested in participating in 4-H, please fill out the self-addressed card and mail it.
