SCHOLARSHIPS

REGULATIONS RELATING TO 4-H PROJECTS

- To be eligible for district and state awards the club member must be enrolled during the current year in the program for which he is competing.
- 2. District winners may be under 14 years of age and enrolled in 4-H work for less than 3 years.
- 3. To be declared a state winner 4-H members must:
 - (a) Be at least 14 years old and not over 19 years old as of January 1, 1970, except in Dairy Calf, Pre-Teen Canning and Early-Teen Canning.
 - (b) Have completed at least 3 years of 4-H work, including the current year, except the projects listed in (a) above.
 - (c) Be unmarried.
 - A 4-H member may attend the National 4-H Congress only twice.
 - (a) The first time as a winner of a state, sectional or national trip in any awards program, and
 - (b) The second time as a state or national winner in either Achievement, Citizenship (National only) or Leadership.
- 5. If a creditable record has not been achieved, no winner will be declared.
- 6. A club member may submit long-time records for district and state competition in not more than two
- programs during the same year. A current year's 4-H record book is required.
- 7. A state winner cannot compete again on any level in the same project.
- A previous state winner in a project which did not provide a trip to National 4-H Congress may participate
 and be declared a state winner in other awards programs.
- A club member who has been awarded a trip to National 4-H Congress may in the future participate and be declared state winner in a project which does not provide a trip to National 4-H Congress
- A club member may be declared state winner in only one 4-H project during the same year (demonstrations excluded).

NORTH CAROLINA 4-H CONGRESS:

Eligibility: Any boy or girl 13 years and above who is currently participating in the 4-H program Location: North Carolina State University, Raleigh, North Carolina

4-H ELECTRIC CONGRESS: (See page 3 for eligibility)

4-H FORESTRY CAMP: (See page 3 for eligibility)

4-H WILDLIFE CAMP: (See page 4 for eligibility)

STATE 4-H HONOR CLUB:

Eligibility: Maximum number shall not exceed .05% of the 4-H enrollment or forty, whichever is larger, of the most outstanding 4-H members in the state with a minimum age of 16 years and 3 years of 4-H experience selected on the basis of service to 4-H program, leadership, moral standards and 4-H activity and project achievements. To become a member the candidate must be in attendance for tapping at N. C. 4-H Congress.

INTERNATIONAL FARM YOUTH EXCHANGE (IFYE):

Eligibility: Young people 20-30 years of age may be nominated, provided \$500 toward the delegate's expense is secured from the county.

Nature of Program: Chosen delegates spend 4 to 6 months in a foreign country.

4-H PEACE CORPS:

Eligibility: Former or present members of 4-H Club 18 years or older and a high school graduate in good physical condition.

Nature of Program: Volunteers serve in a foreign land for 2 year period.

4-H TEEN CARAVAN:

Eligibility: Must be at least 17 to 19 years of age by June 1, 1970 and in good physical condition. Willing to study language of host country.

Cost: Varies from \$975 to \$1,050 (must be borne by individual) See Extension Agent for further information.

DELEGATE TO OUT-OF-STATE PROGRAMS: (2)

Cligibility: 4-H members 16-19 years (each county may nominate a boy and girl with outstanding 4-H record)

Delegate pays own transportation. Host state assumes cost for week.

Nature of Program: Virginia, Georgia and Tennessee invite North Carolina to send a boy and girl to their State 4-H Week.

NATIONAL CITIZENSHIP SHORT COURSE: (Washington, D. C.)

Eligibility: Outstanding 4-H boys and girls 15-19 years of age. (County finances trip).

NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE: (Washington, D. C.) (2) Delegates: State 4-H Officers for current year.

DANFORTH CAMP: (2) American Youth Foundation Leadership Camp (Stony Lake, Michigan)

Eligibility: Application of one boy and one girl 17-19 years of age from each county may be submitted. Panel of judges selects a boy and girl to represent North Carolina 4-H'ers at Danforth Camp. Expenses while in camp are covered by the Danforth Foundation. \$100 toward transportation cost is provided by the N. C. 4-H Development Fund.

(2) Delegate cannot attend more than one of the following during the current year--Danforth, National 4-H Conference, and delegate to Out-of-State events.

4-H DEMONSTRATIONS

- Club members are not eligible to participate in the district contest if by the date of the contest they will have completed a year of training beyond the high school level.
- A maximum of 12 minutes is allowed for each demonstration except Public Speaking (7 minutes) and Poultry Barbecue (2 hours).
- 3. Each county is limited to 10 minutes in Share The Fun in 4-H.
- 4. It is suggested that where practical participants wear the official 4-H uniform.
- Cash awards, either in full or in part, will not be given to district winners in lieu of attending N. C. 4-H Congress. When winner cannot attend Congress, the award will be given to the alternate.

Type

- (1) State award of \$100 is awarded only to those who use the funds toward expenses to compete in the National Junior Horticultural Association contest. To compete in the national contest, individuals must be 14 years of age. If the state winner cannot or elects not to participate in the contest, the award will go to the alternate winner. If state winner is under 14, he will receive a \$25 bond.
- (2) State winner will receive a \$300 Scholarship upon enrollment in college provided peanuts or peanut products (exclusive of peanut oil) are used as a main ingredient in the demonstration. Donor: N. C. Peanut Growers Assoc, Joe Suggs, Executive Secretary, Rocky Mount.
- (3) County awards (junior 9-13 and senior 14-19) are offered in the Sewing Demonstration. County junior winners receive scissors and medal charms; prior junior winners receive a choice, scissors or hem marker; senior winners receive sewing baskets and medal charms. Prior county winners in senior division receive a choice, sewing basket or sleeve board.

- 6. Club members can compete for awards in no more than two demonstration programs (including Dress Revue, Tractor Operator, and Public Speaking), during any one year. Share The Fun in 4-H would not be considered a demonstration program.
- Club members may continue to compete in a particular demonstration until declared state winner. They are no longer eligible to participate in that same program but may participate in others. The same demonstration can be repeated a second year; however, the individual's personal development will be much greater if the demonstration is revised and improved.
- Members in Dress Revue, Sr. Teen Dairy Foods, and Tractor Operator must have passed their 14th birthday but not their 19th birthday January 1 of current year.
- Participants in the sewing demonstrations must be enrolled in the clothing project.
