

4-H PROJECT REGULATIONS

- 1. Age eligibility is established as of January 1, 1977.
- 2. To be eligible for district and state awards, the 4-H member must be enrolled during the current year in the program in which he is competing.
- 3. District winners may be under 14 years of age and enrolled in 4-H for no less than 1 year.
- 4. To be declared a state winner, 4-H members must:
 - (a) Be at least 14 years old and not have passed their 19th birthday by January 1 of the current year except in Dairy Calf, Pre-Teen Canning and Early-Teen Canning.

(b) Have completed at least 1 year of 4-H but preferably 3 or more years including the current year, except the projects listed in (a) above.

- 5. A 4-H member may submit cumulative records for district and state competition in <u>not more than</u> 2 programs during the same year. A 1976 project record is required when the record is submitted in March, 1977, for district and state judging. A 1977 project record may also be included to show work done for 1977.
- 6. If a creditable project record is not submitted in a project area, no winner will be declared.
- 7. A 4-H member may be declared a state winner in only one 4-H project during the same year (demonstration are excluded). A 4-H member declared a state cumulative record program winner is not eligible to represent the county in district or state Dress Revue.
- 8. A state winner cannot compete again on any level in the same project.
- 9. A previous state winner in a project which did not provide a trip to National 4-H Congress may participate and be declared a state winner in other awards programs.
- 10. A 4-H member who has been awarded a trip to National 4-H Congress may not participate in any other project awards program.
- 11. Alternates who are awarded a state award to replace the original state winner <u>may not</u> compete for the same award again. If the award was a trip to National 4-H Congress, that 4-H'er <u>may not</u> participate in any other 4-H project awards program.
- 12. A 4-H member may attend National 4-H Congress only once.
- 13. As of December 1, 1976, some donors have either not renewed their support contracts or not yet been secured for 1977; therefore, should a donor not renew or be secured, the district award will be a certificate and the state award, a \$25 Savings Bond.

4-H DEMONSTRATION REGULATIONS

- 1. Age eligibility is established as of January 1, 1977.
- 2. 4-H members are not eligible, however, to participate in a district contest if by the date of the contest they will have completed a year of training beyond the high school level.
- 3. Members in Automotive Skill Driving must be at least 16 years of age by the time of the contest and must not have passed their 19th birthday by January 1 of the current year.
- 4. A minimum of 5 minutes is recommended and a maximum of 12 minutes is allowed for demonstrations except Public Speaking (7 minutes), Poultry Barbecue, Pork Cookery, and Beef Char-Grill (2 hours). One point will be deducted from the participant's score for each minute the demonstration is over the time limit.
- 5. Four-H members can compete for awards in no more than 1 demonstration program during any one year. Share-the-Fun in 4-H is not considered a demonstration program.
- 6. Each county is limited to a maximum of 10 minutes in the Share-the-Fun in 4-H involving no more than 3 acts.
- 7. A blue, red, or white ribbon is given to every demonstrator. The type of ribbon awarded is based upon the quality of the demonstration. Regardless of the type of ribbon awarded, one demonstrator in each demonstration category will be designated as the district winner and will be eligible to compete on the state level. The only exception to this rule is Share-the-Fun in 4-H in which only blue ribbons are awarded and only selected blue ribbon winners are invited to participate in the State 4-H Talent Show.
- 8. Cash awards, either in full or in part, will not be given to district winners in lieu of the scholarship to attend North Carolina 4-H Congress.
- 9. When the winner cannot attend Congress, the award will be given to the alternate.
- 10. Alternates who are awarded a trip or a state award to replace the state winner may not compete for the same award again.
- 11. Four-H members may continue to compete in a particular demonstration category until declared state winner. They are then no longer eligible to participate in the same program but may participate in others. The same demonstration can be repeated; however, the individual's personal development will be much greater if the demonstration is revised and improved.
- 12. As of December 1, 1976, some donors have either not renewed their support contracts or not yet been secured for 1977; therefore, should a donor not renew or be secured, the district award will be a certificate and the state award, a \$25 Savings Bond.

- (2) Team members must be 15 years of age to compete in the national contest. To qualify for the cash award, the team must go to the contest. Alternate winners awarded a trip to replace state winners may not compete for the same award again.
- (3) For information see Poultry Science Teacher/Leader Guide (4-H L-21-29) and/or mimeographed sheet "Youth Essay Project in Poultry."
- NORTH CAROLINA 4-H CONGRESS: This week of education, recognition and recreation is the highlight of the state 4-H program. Held at N. C. State University, 4-H Congress is open to any boy and girl 13 years of age and above who is currently participating in the 4-H program. Some district winners and invited participants may be younger. Contact: Mary C. Nesbitt.
- JUNIOR DAIRY CONFERENCE: Boys and girls from 14 to 19 years of age may submit applications. During the three-day conference in June, participants will learn about the dairy industry and career opportunities. Applications available through Dairy Husbandry Extension, 104 Polk Hall, N. C. State University, Raleigh, N. C. 27607. Contact: Fred Knott.
- 4-H ELECTRIC CONGRESS: Sponsored by the four major companies servicing North Carolina, Electric Congress is held for all county winning boys and girls in the Electric Project. To attend, one must be at least 12 years of age. A member may attend a second year only if he earns a recruiting award. Recruiting awards are presented to the boy or girl in each county who recruit the greatest number of new members in the Electric Project beyond the minimum requirement of eight. Contact: John Glover
- <u>INTERNATIONAL INTRIGUE PROJECT</u>: The International Intrigue Project is open to all boys and girls between the ages of 9-19 on an individual bases. It is a very flexible project encouraging 4-H members to select any area of interest in international affairs. To be eligible for awards, the 4-H member should submit the record, 4-H R-1-8, or a story of 1000 words or less to the County Extension Office when requested. Contact: Pauline Moore.
 - INTERNATIONAL FARM YOUTH EXCHANGE AND INTERNATIONAL YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROJECT: IFYE and YDP offer the opportunity to study and experience rural life in a foreign country. A young person may apply provided he can secure \$700 from his home county toward his expenses and is in good health, single, and willing to devote time and energy to intensive study of the language, geography, history, culture and agriculture of the country to be visited. IFYE delegates may be 19-25 years old as of the time of departure. His stay is for a period of 4 to 6 months. YDP delegates must be 20 with no upper limit with his stay lasting for a period of 12 to 15 months. Contact: Pauline Moore.
 - DELEGATES TO OUT-OF-STATE PROGRAMS (1): The purpose of delegates to out-of-state events is to provide for other 4-H'ers the opportunity to visit another state's annual meeting for cultural exchange and fellowship. Each county may nominate two boys and two girls (16-19) to be considered for delegates to the state events in Georgia, Tennessee, Pensylvania, Maryland and Virginia. Each delegate chosen is responsible for his own transportation to and from the host state and the host state provides meals and lodging for the week. Counties that have <u>outgoing</u> out-of-state delegates will host incoming delegates from that state during Congress week. Contact: Pauline Moore.
 - DANFORTH LEADERSHIP TRAINING SCHOLARSHIPS (1): Each county may nominate boys and girls (17-19 years of age) who are outstanding in areas of athletics, scholastics, leadership in 4-H and character for consideration to attend the American Youth Foundation Leadership Training Camp in Western Michigan. One boy and one girl will represent North Carolina 4-H'ers at the Camp. Expenses while in camp will be assumed by the Danforth Foundation. One hundred dollars towards transportation costs is provided by the N. C. 4-H Development Fund. Contact: Pauline Moore.

- <u>NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE (1)</u>: The N. C. 4-H Development Fund pays expenses for a delegation of boys and girls to attend the annual week-long conference which is held at the National 4-H Center in Washington, D. C. Delegates to the conference have the opportunity to contribute their ideas and recommendations for 4-H programs in the future. Each county will have an opportunity to nominate boys and girls (16-19 years of age) to be considered for the state delegation. Contact: Henry Revell, Jr.
- NATIONAL CITIZENSHIP SHORT COURSE: Held in Washington, D. C., the course draws on the resources of both governmental and professional personnel to present a thorough and contemporary approach to various aspects of citizenship. The opportunity to participate is open to outstanding 4-H boys and girls (15-19). Expenses are assumed by the county. Contact: Pauline Moore.
- STATE 4-H HONOR CLUB: The State 4-H Honor Club is composed of the most outstanding 4-H members in the state who are at least 16 years of age and have had a minimum of 3 years of 4-H experience. Members are chosen on the basis of service to the 4-H Program, leadership, and moral standards and 4-H activity and project achievement. The maximum number of members inducted each year shall not exceed .05% of the state 4-H enrollment. Application should be made to the State 4-H Office. Contact: Fred Wagoner.
- 4-H FORESTRY AND WILDLIFE CAMP: Boys and girls from 14 to 19 years of age learn about forestry and wildlife at this one-week special program. Scholarships and transportation are available for all participants. For further information on this camp contact the Extension Forestry Department, Biltmore Hall, Post Office Box 5488, N. C. - CONSERVATION AWARDS: Conservation awards for 4-H projects and demonstrations in the areas of wildlife, forestry and related conservation activities are made each year by the N. C. Wildlife Federation. Nominees are selected from state winners in the above areas. Contact: Andrew J. Weber.
- <u>4-H POSTER ART EXHIBIT</u>: The exhibit presents an opportunity to express one's image of 4-H in an artistic manner. Three entries per state may be submitted and will be exhibited at National 4-H Congress in Chicago, Illinois. All state entries will receive a certificate and medallion seal signifying participation in the National 4-H Poster Art Exhibit, courtesy of Coats & Clark, Inc. Contact: Pauline Moore.
 - 4-H TEEN CARAVAN: An opportunity for an exciting summer of learning, living and traveling in other lands is available to the 4-H'er if he is 17 to 19 years of age by June 1 of the year of participation. He must be in good health and willing to study the language of the host country. Cost is determined by the country visited and must be borne by the individual. Contact: Pauline Moore.
 - INTERSTATE COUNTY 4-H EXCHANGE: Exchange trips between counties in differing states offer pleasurable experiences of learning, gaining new ideas and meeting other 4-H'ers. Periodically, the 4-H Newsletter will announce invitations issued by groups from other states. North Carolina counties may initiate invitations to other states by notifying the State 4-H Office which will place the county in contact with the appropriate individual in the desired state.  - ADULT LEADER FORUMS: Volunteer 4-H Adult Leaders will have an opportunity to participate in the Southern Region 4-H Leader Forum October 17-21, 1977.
