REGULATIONS RELATING TO 4-H PROJECTS

- To be eligible for district and state awards the club member must be enrolled during the current year in the program for which he is competing.
- 2. District winners may be under 14 years of age and enrolled in 4-H Club work for less than 3 years.
- 3. To be declared a state winner 4-H Club members must:
 - (a) Be at least 14 years old and not over 19 years old as of January 1 in the year in which the award is won, except in Dairy Calf. Pre-Teen Canning and Early-Teen Canning.
 - (b) Have completed at least 3 years of 4-H Club work, including the current year, except the projects listed in (a) above.
 - (c) Be unmarried.
- 4. A state winner cannot compete again in the same program.
- 5. A 4-H Club member may attend the National 4-H Club Congress only twice.
 - (a) The first time as a winner of a state, sectional or national trip in any awards program, and
 - (b) The second time as a state or national winner in either Achievement, Citizenship, or Leadership.
- 6. If a creditable record has not been achieved, no state award will be given.
- A club member may submit long-time records for district and state competition in not more than two
 programs during the same year. A current year's 4-H record book is required.
- Previous state winners in programs offering state, sectional, or national trips to National 4-H Club
 Congress cannot enter a record for sectional or national consideration in the same program a second
 time.
- A club member who has previously been a state winner in a project which did not provide a trip to National 4-H Club Congress may participate and be declared state winner in another awards program.
- 10. A club member who has been awarded a trip to National 4-H Club Congress may in the future participate and be declared state winner in a project which does not provide a trip to Club Congress.
- 11. A club member may be declared state winner in only one 4-H project during the same year (demonstrations excluded).

4-H DEMONSTRATIONS

Regulations for 4-H Demonstration Programs

- Club members are not eligible to participate if they have completed their freshman year in college.
- A maximum of 15 minutes is allowed for each demonstration except Egg Cookery (20 minutes), Public Speaking (7 minutes) and Poultry Barbecue (2 hours).
- 3. Each county is limited to 10 minutes in Share The Fun in 4-H.
- 4. It is suggested that where practical participants wear the official 4-H uniform.
- Cash awards, either in full or in part, will not be given to district winners in lieu of attending Club Week. When winner cannot attend Club Week, the alternate may receive the award to attend Club Week.

Club members can compete for awards in no more than two demonstration programs (including Dress Revue, Tractor Operator and Public Speaking), during any one year. Share The Fun in 4-H would not be considered a demonstration program.

7. Club members may continue to compete in a particular demonstration until declared state winner. Once they have won the state award they are no longer eligible to participate in that same program but may participate in others. The same demonstration can be repeated a second year; however, the individual's personal development will be much greater if the demonstration is revised and improved.

Eligibility: Most representative boy and girl in each Community 4-H Club (13 years and above) Location: N. C. State University, Raleigh, N. C.

4-H ELECTRIC CONGRESS: (See page 3 for eligibility)

4-H FORESTRY CAMP: (See page 3 for eligibility)

4-H WILDLIFE CAMP: (See page 6 for eligibility)

STATE 4-H HONOR CLUB:

Eligibility: Outstanding member 16 years of age and above with 3 years of 4-H Club Work. (Submit application to the Vice President of the State Honor Club.) (Maximum of 40 selected)

INTERNATIONAL FARM YOUTH EXCHANGE (IFYE)

Eligibility: Young people 20-30 years of age may be nominated, provided \$500 toward the delegate's expense is secured from the county.

Nature of Program: Chosen delegates spend 4 to 6 months in a foreign country.

4-H PEACE CORPS:

Eligibility: Former or present members of 4-H Club 18 years or older and a high school graduate in good physical condition.

Nature of Program: Volunteers serve in a foreign land for 2 year period.

4-H MEMBER INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAM:

Eligibility: Must be at least 17 years of age and under 20 years of age and in good physical condition. Willing to study the language of the host country.

Cost: Varies from \$975 to \$1,050 (must be borne by individual)

CHILEAN NITRATE PROGRAM:

Eligibility: 4-H boys (age 14-19 as of January 1 current year)

Requirements to Compete: (Make a study of Chile and submit in 4-H record binder.) State Award: \$200 Scholarship or equivalent. (Relinquish scholarship if area winner)

Area Award: Two weeks' expense paid trip to Chile (awarded to winner of three state competition - North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia)

Donor: Chilean Nitrate Company

DELEGATE TO OUT-OF-STATE PROGRAMS:

Eligibility: Only high school 4-H members (each county may nominate a boy and girl with outstanding 4-H record)
Delegate pays own transportation.

Nature of Program: Virginia, Georgia and Tennessee invites North Carolina to send a boy and girl to their State
4-H Club Week.

NATIONAL CITIZENSHIP SHORT COURSE: (Washington, D. C.)

Eligibility: Outstanding 4-H boys and girls 15-19 years of age. (County finances trip)

NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE: (Washington, D. C.)

Eligibility: One boy and one girl (16-19 years) from each county with top quality record may be nominated.

Panel of judges selects 2 boys and 2 girls to represent North Carolina.

DANFORTH CAMP: American Youth Foundation Leadership Camp (Stony Lake, Michigan)

Eligibility: Application of one boy and one girl 17-19 years of age from each county may be submitted. Panel of judges selects a boy and girl to represent North Carolina 4-H'ers at Danforth Camp. (See Extension agent for further information.)
