





Plan your garden on paper.

Have your soil tested and follow directions.

Plant only on well-drained soils.

Use compost or other organic matter to improve your soil.

Warm soil is a must for planting warm season crops. Watch young plants carefully for diseases and insects.

Know your problem before treating.

Mulch conserves moisture and controls weeds. Use compost, leaves or straw.

Be ready to irrigate. Your garden needs about 1-inch of water per week in hot weather.

Harvest your vegetables before they get overly ripe. Dispose of spent plants as soon as you've finished the harvest.

Plow your garden at the end of the season.


